Compassion means caring deeply about someone's feelings and wanting to help them when they are suffering or in need.

INFERENCE

4. Why do you think Emma left the cabin door cracked open for the rabbit?

Emma left the door open because she wanted the rabbit to have the choice to return to its home in the forest rather than keeping it trapped inside.

CAUSE AND EFFECT

5. What caused Emma to bring the rabbit inside the cabin?

Emma brought the rabbit inside because she saw that it was shivering and cold from the snow, and she knew she had to help it.

TEXT EVIDENCE

6. How long did it take for the rabbit to get healthy again? What evidence from the text supports your answer?

It took about a week for the rabbit to get healthy. The passage states 'By the following week, the rabbit was healthy again.'
