VOCABULARY

METAPHOR — A comparison between two unlike things without using 'like' or 'as'

SIMILE — A comparison between two unlike things using 'like' or 'as'

PERSONIFICATION — Giving human qualities to non-human things

HYPERBOLE — An extreme exaggeration used for emphasis or effect

IDIOM — A phrase or expression with a meaning different from the literal words

ALLITERATION — The repetition of beginning sounds in nearby words

ONOMATOPOEIA — A word that imitates the sound it represents

PUNCHLINE — The final part of a joke that creates surprise or humor

IMAGERY — Descriptive language that appeals to the five senses

SYMBOLISM — When an object or action represents something beyond its literal meaning

IRONY — When the opposite of what is expected happens

ANALOGY — A comparison between two things to explain how they are alike
