## VOCABULARY

**FIRSTPERSON** — narration using I, me, we pronouns from one character's view

**NARRATOR** — the character or voice telling the story

**OPINION** — a personal belief or judgment about something

**PERSPECTIVE** — the way someone sees or understands things

**THIRDPERSON** — narration using he, she, they pronouns from outside the story

**CHARACTER** — a person in a story with their own thoughts and feelings

**BIAS** — a personal preference that may affect judgment

**DIALOGUE** — conversation between characters that reveals point of view

**PERCEPTION** — how someone understands or interprets events

**SECONDPERSON** — narration using you pronouns addressing the reader directly

**VIEWPOINT** — the position from which a story is told

**FEELINGS** — emotions that shape how a character sees things
